**PE-25-368 Planning Applications**

**25/01703/FUL Land at Hamberts Cottages Burnham Road**

Demolition of 1 & 2 Hamberts Farm Cottages and redevelopment of  
the site to provide 8 x two bed flats in one three-storey block. To  
include ancillary car parking and refuse area to the front, and open  
space to the rear.

The Planning and Environment Committee **OBJECTS** to this application for the following reasons:

### **Overdevelopment and Inappropriate Scale**

The proposal represents a significant intensification of the site. Replacing two modest cottages with a three storey block of eight flats constitutes overdevelopment that is out of keeping with the semi-rural character of this part of Burnham Road.

The height, massing and density fail to respond positively to the local context, contrary to Local Plan Policy DM23 (High Quality and Inclusive Design).

The site has not been included in the SG10 section of the local plan, and the scale of the building does not match other buildings proposed for the new development and will look out of place and isolated.

### **Harm to Local Character and Street scene**

Burnham Road is characterised by low rise dwellings and a transitional rural edge. The proposed block form building would introduce an urbanising and visually intrusive presence, disrupting the established pattern of development. The third floor windows would result in loss of privacy to properties on the other side of the road and those in Brent Avenue.

This conflicts with Policy DM24 (Design and Character) and NPPF guidance requiring development to be sympathetic to local character. We disagree with the self-assessment which claims there would be no loss of habitat. An ariel view of the current site clearly shows important habitat, vegetation and greenery which would be lost and the bat survey is insufficient with lack of monitoring.

### **Highway Safety and Traffic Impact**

Burnham Road is a busy distributor road with high traffic speeds and a known collision history. The proposal would:

- Increase vehicle movements
- Create additional turning manoeuvres at a constrained access
- Add pressure to an already stressed corridor

This raises clear highway safety concerns and conflicts with Policy DM29 (Protecting Living and Working Environments) and Essex County Council's highway safety standards.

The development is located on a section of Burnham Road with no footpath on the application side and no safe pedestrian crossing facilities. The proposal therefore fails to provide safe and suitable access for residents, contrary to NPPF, Chelmsford Local Plan Policy DM29, and Essex Highways design standards 2024. The absence of a footway creates unacceptable risks for pedestrians and undermines opportunities for walking and sustainable travel. The application does not demonstrate how safe pedestrian access will be achieved and is therefore fundamentally unsound. A footpath to the nearby crossing should be provided, as pedestrian access would require crossing a busy road and a grass verge to safely reach the footway.

The proposed position for the parking is close to the Burham Road , which may impact on any further plans to install a footway as part of the new development. In accordance with Policy DM17 of the Development Management Policies as adopted as County Council Supplementary Guidance.

Access to the site should be designed in that left ingress and egress to the site is permitted, ideally with separate entrances and exits. The speed of vehicles on the highway ( to national speed limits for single carriageway road) and increased volumes of traffic would increase the risk of accident.

There lacks space for service vehicles such as delivery vehicles, recycling vehicles, and even during construction would cause traffic and safety concerns.

### **Lack of HIA and loss of Heritage**

There is no Heritage Impact Assessment with this application, as the buildings should be designated as a non-designated heritage asset , as per local plan policy DM13 & contrary to NPPF. We disagree that no assessment was required.

Hamberts Farm Cottages contribute to the historic rural character of the Burnham Road corridor. Under NPPF, the loss of non-designated heritage assets requires clear and convincing justification. The application does not demonstrate that demolition is necessary or that the replacement building would enhance the area. There are few heritage assets in South Woodham Ferrers, these buildings are often mentioned in local guides and are considered locally as historic.

### **Drainage and Surface Water Concerns**

The development significantly increases hardstanding and built footprint. Without robust SuDS measures, the scheme may worsen surface water run-off and localised flooding, contrary to NPPF Section 14 and Chelmsford's climate resilience policies.
