TOWN MAYOR COUNCILLOR DONNA ELEY



It has been another busy year for the Town Council.

Along with my Deputy Mayor, Cllr Toni Perham Lake, we have had the pleasure to meet and speak to many SWF residents at the sixty plus engagements we have carried out this year.

The Town Council have arranged and provided a wide range of new activities, facilities and events.

Since August 2023, Barclays Bank has provided a well-attended Barclays Local in the upstairs meeting room. Essex Police has provided regular Police Surgeries/Let's Talk Sessions at CMH, with the most recent being held on Friday evening, 15th March 2024.

The ever popular Fun at Champions Manor Hall was held weekly during August. Play in the Park at Saltcoats Park/Compass Gardens and run on the Town Council's behalf by Chelmsford City Council was well attended during the Easter and summer school holidays. This year there was a play session during the Easter holidays, being held at Saltcoats Park with an inflatable assault course. The Seniors Film Club held every month on the second Wednesday continues to prove popular. March's film "Oppenheimer" had an audience of nearly 50 despite being three hours long! Free tea, coffee and biscuits are provided and has been usually served by the Town Mayor. All for only £5.00 per year membership.

New events in the coming year included an Easter Egg Hunt held on 2nd April 2024, which sold out within a week. Save the Dates for your diary are 6th June 2024 and 8th June 2024 for D-Day 80th Anniversary Celebrations. All these events and activities, are planned and agreed by the Events, Community and Leisure Committee along with our hard-working and enthusiastic staff.

The Planning and Environment Committee have considered and made comment on 72 planning applications, up to 30th April 2024, as consultees to Chelmsford City Council. Our Environment Officer, has been busy developing an updated a Climate and Environment Plan and overseeing the maintenance and improvements in the John Cox recreation area and Woodham Fen and Garden of Remembrance.

The Finance and Projects Committee have had a busy year streamlining and helping audit the Council's finances. Projects approved include the updating and improvement of the facilities at Champions Manor Hall. This includes all the internal areas of the whole building have been painted, new blinds replaced in the two halls and a new television in the conference room upstairs.

A project for solar panel is ongoing in collaboration with Chelmsford City Council to consider the best proposal.

Grants have been issued to several local groups including United in Kind for Dementia Week. The rise in energy costs and inflationary pressures, has meant that balancing the budget proved to be a time-consuming task. I am pleased to say that, once again, South Woodham Ferrers Town Council were able to achieve one of the lowest parish council increases in Essex. With an increase of only 0.85p to £73.45 for a typical Band D property, a rise of just 1% for 2024/25.

In the office, all staff do a fantastic job organising and handling the day-to-day activities of the Council, dealing with residents queries and planning and organising the many events the Town Council. I would like to personally thank the staff for all their enthusiasm and hard work. Our ESO's continue to tirelessly help keep our streets tidy. One ESO has extended hours and taken on a new role, in an effort to keep our town, clean, safe and tidy. South Woodham Ferrers Annual Town Meeting was held on Thursday 23rd April 2024 at Champions Manor Hall from 7pm. There were displays from Community Groups and refreshments. Speakers included Julie Taylor from the Liam Taylor Legacy, who spoke about her personal experience of knife crime and the importance of bleed kits, and Police Sergeant Matt Collins from Essex Police, plus presentations from all the Chairs of the Council Committees. The Mayor of Chelmsford, Linda Mascot also attended. I had the pleasure to present the Distinguished Honours Awards to the well-deserved nominees and the Town Mayor's Award to William de Ferrers student, Jack Hughes. The winners of the photography competition were also presented with their awards. The Mayor's Charity, since September 2023, has been Haven's Hospice, in particular, Little Haven's, and I presented them with a cheque for £799.75 the total of the donations raised during the past six months.

This will be the final written update from me this year. I have been proud and pleased to meet and represent the residents of South Woodham Ferrers in my second year as Town Mayor. I enjoyed seeing you at the Annual Town Meeting but in the meantime....

We have had regular hirers in all year this year with more and more groups booking the facility. We hope to welcome more and more regular hirers, providing various activities for our residents.


FINANCE & PROJECTS COMMITTEE

The Finance & Projects Committee is responsible for Town Council land and premises as well as civic affairs and public relations, including;

- Agree and review council policies and procedures for full council to consider
- · Agree financial policies and budgets for full council to consider
- Consider new projects to enhance the local community

The Committee co-ordinates the budgetary process and recommends a precept to cover the annual expenses of the Council, which is determined at a Council meeting in January each year. For the financial year 2024/2025 the Band D Precept has increased by £0.85p to £73.45 an increase of 1%. The precept for 2024/25 is £449,200.
