TOWN MAYOR COUNCILLOR DONNA ELEY



The past year has seen the country return to normality, and as the government termed "personal responsibility", following the restrictions of previous two covid

years. It has been a roller coaster of a council year, punctuated with national several royal events. Starting in June with country's joy in celebrating Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee, the sadness and respect in which her death was marked in September and will end in May of this year with a celebration for King Charles III's Coronation. One of my first duties as Mayor was attending the Platinum Jubilee Fayre held on the Village Hall Playing Fields and I was proud to light the Beacon on behalf of the residents of South Woodham Ferrers. The Town Council along with the Village Hall and Village Hall Playing Fields are in the throes of organising the Coronation Lunch & Fayre held on Sunday 7th May perfectly rounded off my Mayorship this year.

Throughout the year Champions Manor Hall has been pleased to see a steady increase in groups returning to hire it's two meeting rooms and two halls, and has welcomed new hirers, the facilities are to open for hire seven days a week. The Toddler group opened its doors on Monday 26th April 2022 and has proven to be a roaring success with the young families of SWF. It is ably run by volunteers on behalf of the Town Council and we are grateful for their enthusiasm and commitment in making the group the success it has become. The Seniors Film Club held on the second Wednesday of the month has seen a steady return to normality and it currently has over a hundred members and we had a

record attendance in February. The annual membership is up for renewal in April and costs £5.00 with free tea, coffee and biscuits.

The Planning & Environment Committee continues to consider, through a streamlined process and as consultee, all planning applications in and around SWF that are submitted to Chelmsford City Council. The members have considered and submitted comments for consultations in Maldon District Council and Chelmsford City Council areas which could impact SWF residents. Comments have been submitted for outline planning and full planning for the Development North of Burnham Road. Their work will continue scrutinising new planning applications as they are submitted and as the development progresses.

Events, Community and Leisure Committee have been throughout the year organising events for residents including the ever popular Seniors Parties including the Platinum Jubilee and Christmas Parties last year and the recent Coronation Big Lunch in May. During the August, Fun at Champions Manor Hall and the Halloween Party were popular with families. And I know this is said by each consecutive Town Mayor but the Christmas Fayre and Light switch-on, in my opinion, was the very best so far. The Parent & Toddler Group, Seniors Film Club and Youth Club fall under the Committee's remit too.

The Finance and Projects Committee is a more transparent Committee now and all councillors are welcome to sit on it. They have also had a busy year considering the Council's finances and considering ways to improve the income of Champion Manor Hall. It has been particularly difficult balancing the budget, but the Town Council's precept will only increase by 1%, £1.25, to £72.60 for a Band D property for the financial year 2023/4. One of the lowest parish council increases in Essex.

In the office we have a new Town Clerk, Karen Atkins along with a new Administrative Assistant, Debbie Edwards and a new Environment & Leisure Officer David Smith. Shaun and John, our ESO's, do a brilliant job of helping to keep our streets tidy and free of litter. My thanks also to all the Town Councillors for their support and advice this year, especially my Deputy Mayor Alan Shearring. All Councillors are volunteers and the time and effort they commit is very much appreciated. Without the hard work and commitment of our staff and Town Councillors, the Town Council would not be able to function and provide range of activities and events for our residents it does.

On the 17th March 2023 we held our Annual Town Meeting. This years interesting speaker was from Essex & Herts Air Ambulance. Many thanks to them and to all the local community stalls and businesses that attended this meeting. Also thank you to Rt Hon Sir John Whittingdale MP for also attending.

This year Council awarded two Distinguished Services awards. One posthumously to Mr Tony Graham for all his work with the Rotary and one award to Raymond Towey for arranging the litter pick events during the year.

This year we also presented past awards that had been delayed due to Covid. Mrs Olive Anstead, Cllr Peter Wyatt and Jonathan Coggan.







This will be the last update by me for this Council year. I have been both pleased and proud to meet and represent, you, the residents this year.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS AND CONSULTATIONS

Monthly meetings to discuss local planning applications put through to Chelmsford City Council average to about 9 applications every meeting.

In addition to these, responses have also been prepared and submitted on 7 consultation documents which have varied from the new proposed path of the new pylons to a proposed development of 750 dwellings at Althorne.



For the financial year 2023/2024 the Band D Precept has increased by £1.25. The precept for 2023/24 is £442,251
