Introduction to the 2015/16 Report

Once more I am pleased to present our Annual Report from the Town Council for the year ending 31 March 2016. This year was, of course, an election year with Parliamentary, City Council and Town Council elections all taking place. Unusually we also had two Town Council by-elections during the year and we are pleased to welcome 17 Councillors back to continue supporting our residents and 3 new Councillors. Inside this report you will find an illustration of the changes to council Tax for the coming year and we use those funds to provide and support services in South Woodham Ferrers.

The Town Mayor's charity for 2015/16 - South East and Central Essex MIND has been well supported through a series of fund raising activities. As a local mental health charity, South East and Central Essex Mind is one of 160 affiliated members of Mind, each being an independent charity run by local people, for local people and responsible for its own funding and the services it provides.

Mental health is very often the 'elephant in the room' but many of us will have friends and relatives who have suffered from stress, depression, anxiety or the feeling that they can't cope with the stresses of modern life.

Town Council Funding in 2016/17

Council Tax & your Town Council

Council Tax paid by local residents, forming a small part of the total charge which includes charges for Essex County Council, Essex Police and Chelmsford City Council.

For the year ahead, (starting on 1 April 2016), the Town Council has set a budget that both reduces its expenditure and increases its income. Therefore There are plenty of other items on the full list and there will be no increase in our element of the local Council Tax.

How much will I pay?

For a Band D property in the town the charge for 2016/17 (for the Town Council element) will be £59.40 for the whole year.

What does the Town Council spend this on?

The Town Council owns, maintains and runs;

- Champions Manor Hall Community Centre,
- The Garden of Remembrance on Burnham Road,
- Woodham Fenn,
- John Cox and Victoria Fields recreational sites (near Ferrers Road),
- The Blue Cage and children's play area at the Village Hall,
- The Bandstand in the town centre and
- Millennium Place (where the war memorial and town sign stand).

Payments to the Town Council are included in the The Council also provides a public events programme (including the Christmas Fayre and the popular cinema club), provides a local grants programme and helps to fund the local swimming pool. In summer the Council provides the hanging baskets around the town and in winter lights up the town centre for Christmas.
