C25-276 Representative on Outside Bodies

- Councillor Barnett updated that she had attended a meeting with the Chelmsford Association of Local Councils (CALC) on Wednesday 21st January. The group has decided to prioritise monitoring Local Government Reorganisation to ensure parish councils have a say on decisions where possible and are working closely with the Essex Association of Local Councils to do so. It was also agreed that a key priority of the group is to facilitate knowledge sharing across local councils. As a result, most future meetings will include a guest speaker, as demonstrated by the most recent meeting attended, which featured a presentation on Community Speed Watch."
- Councillor Wilson updated Council as representative on the Village Hall committee. The Village Hall has £25k in bank accounts as per 2nd March. The accounts are all done and independently examined. They are running a small loss at £3,300 approximately at the moment but predicted to break even at financial year end as Trading Company settles rent. Car park dispute incurred legal fees, but Village Hall has now cancelled the contract legally. An Asda grant was received for the new bingo group to provide tea and coffee for them. Family Nights restarted in February with eight families attending -next one on Saturday 25th April. Players' Lounge floor restoration project has been postponed until after AGM. AGM is on 25th March and all welcome to attend.

C25-277 Chelmsford City Council / Essex County Council

Chelmsford City Council

Council received report(s) from City Councillors/County Councillor concerning matters of interest to South Woodham Ferrers.

Councillor Donne Eley updated she had attended the Presentation Evening at William de Ferrers School on 5th March 2026 by Year 9 students on the Make space for Girls/Public Spaces project. Along with Cllrs Shearring, Kelly and Sherlock, representatives from CCC Community Safety Team and Parks and Green Spaces and parents/carers. It was really pleasing and inspiring to see the

presentations from a group of students who prior to the project were extremely lacking in confidence.

The footpaths in Saltcoats Park and Compass Gardens will be renovated over the next few weeks. The material has been delivered to Saltcoats and a contractor is in place to complete the work once the ground is firm enough to take machinery without damaging the grass/pitches.

Some of you may be aware that there was debris behind the bushes alongside the Burnham Road B1012 from a former homeless camp. Over the winter I noticed that this had been fly-tipped with old electrical appliances. It has been reported to Chelmsford City Council and should be cleared once the verges are firm enough to hold a large truck.

I would like to reassure all our female residents, or any resident who feels threatened in anyway, in SWF, that if they feel uncomfortable or threatened in any way by a stranger as they walk around the town, then they should report this to Essex Police immediately either on 999, 1010 or at Essex.police.uk. All such reports are taken seriously. This is following two incidents that took place by Marsh Farm on 13th March 2026. I have been assured by Sergeant Matt Dalby of Maldon NPT, that when the second incident was reported a car was despatched and a search was undertaken of the area. Unfortunately, no-one was found matching the description of the man. Patrols are still being undertaken in that area.

Councillor Eley informed Council and our residents that she will be standing for the Woodham Ferrers Division at the Essex County Council elections on 7th May 2026.

Councillor Terry Sherlock updated Sandon Park & Ride – If you use the double decker bus route seven hundred from First Bus the ticket includes parking.

05th March 2026 – he attended Opportunity East – The Infrastructure & Investment Conference in Ipswich. Jack Abbot MP spoke about a common brand and narrative for the East of England when seeking inward investment and government funding infrastructure. There are many large projects that could benefit us here for employment or travel etc. Sizewell C, Lower Thames Crossing, Stanstead expansion, Universal Theme Park in Bedfordshire. He had a quick chat with Jonathan Denby from Greater Anglia and should be having a future meeting with him, let me know any questions or points you would like me to raise, Tap and go now working from Wickford and Jonathan Denby did say that when you put on more trains it was amazing how the passengers just appear and start using the train.

Greater Essex Strategic Authority comes into being very soon, with Tom Walker the interim CEO.

Councillor Murrough O'Brien updated that he attended the Policy board meeting on the amended local plan. Councillor Bob Massey would give the formal outcome.

Essex County Council

Councillor Bob Massey updated:

Chelmsford City Council

Last week's meeting of the Development Policy Board, which Cllr O'Brien and I attended, reviewed the Feedback received for the Local Plan – Additional Sites Consultation, with particular attention to the potential threats to 'Green Wedges' from new smaller site proposals. It was agreed that authority be

delegated to the Director of Sustainable Communities in consultation with the Cabinet Member for a Greener Chelmsford to (I) make any necessary minor amendments to the Feedback Report Document and the Additional Sites Integrated Impact Assessment Feedback Report and prepare all necessary documentation to support the submission of the revised Local Plan for Independent Examination.

Essex County Council

Local Government Reorganisation

The County Council has been advised that HM Government will tomorrow (Wednesday March 25th) announce the proposed LGR structures, including how many Unitary Authorities will be created to replace the current fifteen authorities across Greater Essex.

Essex Highways

This lunchtime (Tuesday March 24th) Cllr Massey drove the Cabinet Member for Highways down to South Woodham to experience for himself the woeful state of the A132 between Shaw Farm and the Rettendon Turnpike. He agreed that further repairs are required, and will inform me when improvements will be undertaken,

He also advised me that he has initiated a project to fully rebuild the road and '*make it fit for the next fifty years.*' Initial thoughts from highways engineers suggest a budget of around £20 million, and reconstruction period - including significant disruption - of up to a year. Then, of course, the project will need to be funded.

And finally, he confirmed that the proposed upgrade of the 'Asda' pedestrian crossing to a light controlled 'Puffin' crossing is still scheduled for this summer's school holidays. Essex Highways requested a further £20,000 to cover road surface improvements, we can only hope that that includes resolving the ramp on the road outside Hamilton Court.
