

Easter Events Summary Report

Event 1: Easter Wildlife Sessions

Date: Thursday 2nd April

Two Easter-themed wildlife sessions were delivered by Wild Science and were split by age group to ensure suitability and engagement for all children attending.

Session 1: Ages 0–5 Years

- **Places available:** 25
- **Attendance:** 16
- **Absentees:** 9

Session 2: Ages 5–10 Years

- **Places available:** 25
- **Attendance:** 19
- **Absentees:** 6

Both sessions were extremely well run, with Wild Science delivering an engaging and educational experience. A variety of animals were brought along, including:

- A corn snake
- A scorpion
- A short-tailed gerbil
- A gecko
- A large snail
- A rabbit (a particularly fitting addition for the Easter theme)

The children who attended thoroughly enjoyed the sessions and were actively engaged throughout. Feedback from parents and carers was very positive.

Following the older children's session, approximately **10 children stayed on** to watch the film *Hop* on the large screen in the Main Hall, helping to extend the experience and create a relaxed community atmosphere.

Overall, this event was considered a great success, despite some non-attendance, and Wild Science delivered a high-quality and memorable activity for those who took part.

Event 2: Easter Egg Hunt in Town

The Easter Egg Hunt was held across the town and involved **18 local businesses**, each hosting an Easter egg in their shop window for children to find.

Children collected a worksheet from the Bandstand and searched the town to find the eggs displayed in the business windows. Once completed, worksheets were returned to the Bandstand where children received a treat from the Easter Bunny, played by **Cllr. Knox**, assisted by **Cllr. Price** and **Cllr. Barnett**.

- **Total treats available:** 200
- **Treats remaining:** 25
- **Estimated participants:** 175 children

The strong uptake clearly demonstrated the popularity of the event, with excellent engagement from families and strong support from local businesses. The atmosphere throughout the town was lively and positive, helping to promote community involvement and footfall to participating shops.
